Scripture: Psalm 118:1-29 (NAS)

Topic: "Salvation: The Source of a Thankful Heart"

- 1 Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; For His lovingkindness is everlasting.
- 2 Oh let Israel say, "His lovingkindness is everlasting."
- 3 Oh let the house of Aaron say, "His lovingkindness is everlasting."
- 4 Oh let those who fear the LORD say, "His lovingkindness is everlasting."
- 5 From my distress I called upon the LORD; The LORD answered me and set me in a large place.
- 6 The LORD is for me; I will not fear; What can man do to me?
- 7 The LORD is for me among those who help me; Therefore I will look with satisfaction on those who hate me.
- 8 It is better to take refuge in the LORD Than to trust in man.
- 9 It is better to take refuge in the LORD Than to trust in princes.
- 10 All nations surrounded me; In the name of the LORD I will surely cut them off.
- 11 They surrounded me, yes, they surrounded me; In the name of the LORD I will surely cut them off.
- 12 They surrounded me like bees; They were extinguished as a fire of thorns; In the name of the LORD I will surely cut them off.
- 13 You pushed me violently so that I was falling, But the LORD helped me.
- 14 The LORD is my strength and song, And He has become my salvation.
- 15 The sound of joyful shouting and salvation is in the tents of the righteous; The right hand of the LORD does valiantly.
- 16 The right hand of the LORD is exalted; The right hand of the LORD does valiantly.
- 17 I will not die, but live, And tell of the works of the LORD.
- 18 The LORD has disciplined me severely, But He has not given me over to death.
- 19 Open to me the gates of righteousness; I shall enter through them, I shall give thanks to the LORD.
- 20 This is the gate of the LORD; The righteous will enter through it.
- 21 I shall give thanks to You, for You have answered me, And You have become my salvation.
- 22 The stone which the builders rejected Has become the chief corner stone.
- 23 This is the LORD'S doing; It is marvelous in our eyes.
- 24 This is the day which the LORD has made; Let us rejoice and be glad in it.
- 25 O LORD, do save, we beseech You; O LORD, we beseech You, do send prosperity!
- 26 Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the LORD; We have blessed you from the house of the LORD.
- 27 The LORD is God, and He has given us light; Bind the festival sacrifice with cords to the horns of the altar.
- 28 You are my God, and I give thanks to You; You are my God, I extol You.
- 29 Give thanks to the LORD, for He is good; For His lovingkindness is everlasting.
